

University of Miami Yellow Ribbon Grant Application (2016-2017 Academic Year) *

The Yellow Ribbon GI Education Enhancement Program (YRP) is a provision of the Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2008. Only individuals entitled to the maximum benefit rate (based on service requirements) may receive this funding.

You may be eligible if:

- You served an aggregate period of active duty after September 10, 2001, of at least 36 months:
- You were honorably discharged from active duty for a service connected disability and served 30 continuous days after September 10, 2001;
- ❖ You are a dependent eligible for Transfer of Entitlement under the Post-9/11 GI Bill based on a veteran's service under the eligibility criteria listed above.

All veterans may apply for the Yellow Ribbon Grant regardless of your current chapter. However, in order to receive funding you must be Chapter 33 approved. If you are selected for the Yellow Ribbon Grant, you should then apply for Chapter 33 if you have not already done so. Please note that if you change your benefit to Chapter 33, it will be irrevocable. Upon notification that you have been selected for the Yellow Ribbon Grant, you will have 2 weeks from the date of notification to submit your application for Chapter 33 status. If you do not apply for Chapter 33 within that time frame, you will forfeit your Yellow Ribbon Grant and will then need to reapply.

The VA will determine eligibility for the Post-9/11 GI Bill (Chapter 33), and issue a Certificate of Eligibility. The Certificate of Eligibility will advise you if your service meets the requirements for the Yellow Ribbon Grant. Bring this certificate to the Veterans' Program Administrator in the Office of the Registrar at the University of Miami.

Post-9/11 GI Bill Benefits are payable for training pursued on or after August 1, 2009. Yellow Ribbon Grants for 2016-2017 are payable for enrollment periods beginning on or after August 1, 2015.

You will be notified of the annual award for each academic year. University of Miami agrees to participate in the Yellow Ribbon Grant for the 2016-2017 academic year, under the Post-9/11 GI Bill (authorized under title V of Public Law 110-252) subject to the terms, conditions, and representations provided in the Yellow Ribbon Grant Agreement and applicable VA regulations.

University of Miami agrees to provide contributions to eligible individuals who apply for the Yellow Ribbon Grant, regardless of the rate at which the individual is pursuing training (i.e., full-time versus less than full-time), during the 2016-2017 academic year. The University of Miami will award Yellow Ribbon Grants for eligible undergraduate, graduate, law, and medical students for the 2016-2017 academic year.

Please note: Undergraduate and Graduate programs offer an unlimited number of grants. The Law School offers a maximum of 15 grants and they are awarded on a first come- first served basis. The Miller School of Medicine offers a maximum of 5 grants and they are awarded on a first come-first served basis.

- University of Miami agrees to provide contributions on behalf of a
 participating individual during the current academic year and all subsequent
 academic years in which University of Miami participates in the Yellow
 Ribbon Grant, provided that the individual maintains satisfactory progress,
 conduct, and attendance according to the regularly prescribed standards of
 the University of Miami.
- University of Miami agrees to limit contributions made on behalf of a
 participant to funds under the restricted control of University of Miami (e.g., a
 scholarship sent directly to University of Miami on behalf of an individual or
 specific group of individuals from a third party may not be included in Yellow
 Ribbon Grant contributions). Funds received directly or indirectly from
 Federal sources may not be counted toward contributions.
- University of Miami agrees to provide the maximum amount of contributions payable toward the unmet established tuition charges to each participating individual during each semester the individual is enrolled; if University of Miami total contribution towards the individual's unmet established tuition charges for the semester do not exceed the maximum dollar amount payable during the academic year.

*<u>Please note:</u> The Yellow Ribbon Grant only applies to the Fall and Spring semesters. The Summer Sessions are <u>not</u> covered by this Grant.
